There is a local market with handicrafts and jewelry and not far from the village is even a natural swimming pool.


Practical information

The delegates arrange their flights to and from Nairobi, the local organizer take care of the transport from Nairobi to Ngurunit and back (one long day or two shorter days).

Accommodation is at one of the campsites in Ngurunit, you choose comfort. The campsites are guarded 24 hours, and except for one or two geckos or monkeys you do not have to fear any unexpected visitors.

There is a medical clinic in Ngurunit.

There will be a mixture of traditional Kenyan and western food cooked in a safe way.
