

## Landscape Education –Time Travel in Mamre 27 September 2018

During the month of September a Time Travel event was presented at the Mamre Nature garden. CapeNature, in collaboration with the Cochoqua Royal House Mamre, The Heritage and Tourism committee Mamre, The City of Cape Town and the Mamre Primary School, went back in time utilizing the Time Travel method by Bridging Ages, an International Organisation in Historic Environmental Education and Time Travels. Some of the Key questions during the event is "How to keep the valley green, what is the advantage of biodiversity to the people, what is the Khoi future and the Khoi way of living."
